"I joined the study because I believe in the cause - I want to understand the why's of COVID-19 and the cause of this terrible germ. I also want to make a lasting difference!"




ONG-TERM CARE What We Know about COVID-19 Immunity

Vaccines are Working! 4th and 5th doses reduce infections.



^{*}Most participants got their boosters during these ranges.

Our study shows antibody boost from 5th dose!



Vaccines are helping, but the highest prevalence of severe COVID-19 cases are still in older adults of age 80+.

The same COVID-19 infection that may present as mild symptoms in a child or young adult can be very severe for an older adult.



It is important that we take individual responsibility to protect our most vulnerable population.
